

POMP, CIRCUMSTANCE, AND OTHER SONGS OF A LIFETIME

—by Professor David Citino, 1947-2005, Late University Poet Laureate (Originally presented as the 2000 Winter Commencement address)

If you're like me, you've got a big head, not to mention a funny robe, full of music—poems and melodies, the tunes we move to, shower and shave by, study, write to. Not just the incidental,

but the momentous music keeping time. Our histories are measures of song. Listen to your heart: drums of Africa, sea-spume of blind, far-sighted Homer, Sappho's honeyed love lyrics. Often,

music speaks for us, one note saying a thousand words. Like Rodolpho in Puccini's La Boheme, Sono un poeta. I am a poet. Che cosa faccio? What do I do? Scrivo. I write. This ceremony

is loud music—pomp and circumstance of the life you began freshman year or that first day of graduate school. In my head I press *Play*, and the CD of Big Days kicks on. I leap and linger

over moments too sweet, nearly, for words. I'll never escape rhymes from the nursery. Up above the world so high, like a diamond in the sky. We knew from the start our universe was aglow with wonder.

Italian, Latin, English songs in nasal accents of Cleveland. Gaudeamus igitur, Juvenes dum sumus. So, let us rejoice, while we are young. Youth is that gift we can't comprehend while we're young. This ceremony

means you all are less young than you were. Don't let the heavy knowledge gained from your studies deprive you of the gifts of youth, to be able to rejoice at the drop of a hat, to care for, be moved by others.

Now I hear golden hits of five decades. Big Mama Thornton, and that so-called King (King of what, fried butter sandwiches?) who stole away her hound dog. You ain't never killed a rabbit, you ain't no friend

of mine. As with those profs and TAs, course after course, you had to produce kill some rabbits—to earn respect. And at times OSU may have seemed like Heartbreak Hotel, down at the end

of Lonely Street, so difficult was it to do your best. Tennessee Ernie Ford, "Sixteen Tons": St. Peter don't you call me 'Cause I can't go. I owe my soul to the company store. You have been digging deep in mines of knowledge. We all owe our souls to Ohio State, company store of learning, shared experience—precious ore we have in common forever.

Now I hear Domenico Modugno's fervent urging to wish, sing, fly, Volare, Wo-o- Cantare, Wo-o-o-o. My grandfather was a peasant farmer, a contadino in Calabria in the toe

of Italy. He knew it's the human lot to dream of flying. Lucky, lucky, lucky me, I'm a lucky son-of-a-gun. I work eight hours, I sleep eight hours, That leaves eight hours for fun.

Hey! He sailed in steerage across the Atlantic, came to Cleveland, where he stayed long enough to work 52 years for the B&O Railroad, before lying down to rest in good Ohio soil. So many of us

here today came from elsewhere, or ancestors did. From Tennessee, Italy, Africa, Asia, Appalachia—even, President Kirwan, the wilds of Kentucky and Maryland. Women and men with backs

supple as birch trunks. The courage it took to pick up stakes and begin again in a new world! Think of the work those older ones did. For you. You all are facing a change right now.

This sheepskin is your passport. You're bound for emigration to the next song of your life. Ohio State is the ark on which you've been sailing. You've been the precious cargo.

But, as Noah once said, *I can see clearly now the rain is gone*. The ark, our university, was filled to overflowing with the *diversity* of us. Diversity. Networks and talk shows devalue the word.

I say, rather, the richness of us, precious difference, the grand multiplicity of selves that balance this globe and enable it to spin true. Grandson of peasant immigrants, I was given

the opportunity to earn a doctorate in English literature from Ohio State because my family labored long nights around the kitchen table trying to learn this arduous English. I sat where you're sitting twenty-six years ago. Bob Dylan and Smokey Robinson got me through. Yes, it took a prophet and Miracles! My son earned an OSU Ph.D. in history. Now you, graduates, are being honored—

by degrees. We've all come together around the kitchen table of Ohio State. Ohio, Round on the ends and high in the middle. For the years to come we'll sing together, Beautiful Ohio,

in dreams again I see, Visions of what used to be. These psalms, sacred thoughts of our tribes, 78's and 33's, tapes, CD's—they take up space in shelves of our skulls, our hearts. They remind us

we want a song beyond the runof-the-mill thrill, the moment throbbing with pleasure or bathed in the blues. We ache for something grander than pure selfishness. Songs sung for one

alone are not true music. Arias shared are music of the spheres, ways of saying to another something from the soul. Of course the Buckeye Battle Cry is there. Drive, drive on down the field,

Men (and women!) of the Scarlet and Gray. Well, you drove on down the field, and you drove up and down the streets, around and around crowded lots, looking for a place to park,

and you searched our dark, ancient library for a decent place to study. My wife, Mary's, father marched in the first "Script Ohio," in 1936. He's here today with us, blowing his horn, I can't help

but feel, as is the sweet mother I lost last year, the one who gave me the stars. Today's music makes us think of the debts we owe, and never can repay. So many of us would not be here

were it not for the lullabyes and songs of dear parents, their parents, theirs. Some are here today in the flesh. Many are not. We mourn them with cadences. of our hearts. Think how many people

sang before us, gave us a name, a voice, taught us the right words. We must cherish them by remembering every song. When we sing to others, we honor our fathers and mothers, thank them

for this day of profound scarlet and gray pomp and circumstance. O, come let's sing Ohio's praise, And songs to Alma Mater raise. Alma mater. Ohio State is our sweet, nurturing mother.

We came of age here, with her help. Well, Mother, we love you, but, like, it's time we moved out, got a place of our own. You're standing there, Mom, gray hair, eyes scarlet

from crying. We won't forget you. Now, even though this ceremony means we're being weaned, taken off the nipple, let's take care to cherish her all our days. Let's remember

the words to the songs she taught us, and pass them on. We'll remember always, Graduation Day. Summer's heat, and winter's cold, The seasons pass, the years will roll, Time and change

will surely show How firm thy friendship, O-hi-O. We call that little number Carmen Ohio. Carmen means song in Latin. You've worked hard; she is your reward; today is your reward.

You're filled to overflowing with the notes, the poems we've written together. You know the score. Continue to work hard for yourselves, and one another. Find the ones who need

you to sing to, for them, in the world. Graduates, this joyful litany, this hymn our ancestors collaborated on with us, the calling of your name today is music to our ears. Sing that name proudly

all your days, as if your life depended on it. It does, you know. It has been an honor for me to speak—and sing to you today. Thank you, graduates, and, again, Congratulations.



Shirley Ann Jackson

Doctor of Science

hirley Ann Jackson is the 18th president of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, and Hartford, Connecticut, the oldest technological research university in the United States.

A theoretical physicist, Dr. Jackson earned a bachelor of science degree in physics and a doctorate in theoretical elementary particle physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, becoming the first African American woman to receive a doctorate in any field from MIT and one of the first two African American women in the country to earn a doctorate in physics.

In 1995, she was appointed chair of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) by President Clinton. During her four-year tenure at NRC, she reorganized the agency and completely revamped its regulatory approach by moving to risk-informed, performance-based regulation. Prior to her NRC appointment, Dr. Jackson was a theoretical physicist at the former AT&T Bell Laboratories and a professor of theoretical physics at Rutgers University.

Over the past five years, Dr. Jackson has worked to bring national attention to what she has dubbed the "Quiet Crisis" in America—the threat to the nation's capacity to innovate due to the looming shortage in the science and technology workforce.

In 2002, she was named one of the Top 50 Women in Science by *Discover* magazine and recognized in a book published by ESSENCE as one of "50 of the Most Inspiring African Americans." She was also named one of "50 R&D Stars to Watch" by *Industry Week* magazine. She was inducted into the Women in Technology International Hall of Fame in 2000 and into the National Women's Hall of Fame in 1998 for her contributions as a distinguished scientist and an advocate for education, science, and public policy.

Dr. Jackson is immediate past chair of the board at the American Association for the Advancement of Science and currently chair of its board of directors. She is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Physical Society, and she has advisory roles in other prestigious national organizations. She serves as a trustee of the Brookings Institution and is a life member of the MIT Corporation, a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, and a member of the executive committee of the Council on Competitiveness.

In addition, Dr. Jackson serves on the boards of Georgetown University and Rockefeller University, the New York Stock Exchange, the Smithsonian Institution, and several major corporations.

Neta A. Bahcall

Doctor of Science

eta A. Bahcall is professor of astrophysical sciences at Princeton University and director of the university's Council on Science and Technology. She is one of the leading experts in the world on the study of clusters of galaxies, the largest structures in the universe that are held together by their own gravity.

A native of Israel, Professor Bahcall earned her bachelor's degree in physics and mathematics from Hebrew University in Jerusalem, her master's degree in nuclear physics from Israel's Weizmann Institute of Science, and her doctorate in astrophysics from Tel Aviv University under the direction of William A. Fowler of the California Institute of Technology. She joined the Princeton faculty of astrophysical sciences in 1971.

From 1983 to 1989, she served at the

Space Telescope Science Institute in Baltimore as astronomer and chief of the General Observer Support Branch and head of the Science Program Selection Office for Hubble Space Telescope Observations. In 1989, she returned to Princeton as full professor, director of the Undergraduate Program in Astronomy, and director of the Council on Science and Technology. In addition, she is director of Princeton's Teaching Postdoctoral Fellowship Program in Science and Engineering.

Professor Bahcall has gained international renown for her pioneering work on observational cosmology, and her research has provided the current standard model of our expanding universe. Her work showed that the universe is "lightweight," containing an insufficient amount of matter to halt the universal expansion; the universe is, therefore, destined to expand forever. She is the author of more than 250 scientific publications and is frequently invited to speak at international conferences and public lectures. She is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, past vice president of the American Astronomical Society, and a member of the National Astronomy and Astrophysics Advisory Committee. She is a member of the Sloan Digital Sky Survey and first chair of its Science Advisory Committee.

Her many honors include Century Lecturer of the American Astronomical Society, Strum Lecturer at Wesleyan University, Benjamin Dean Lecturer at the California Academy of Sciences, Capital Science Lecturer at the Carnegie Institution, Nobel Lecturer at the Nobel Symposium in Stockholm, and Merle Kingsley Distinguished Fellow at Caltech.

Gurdev S. Khush

Doctor of Science

urdev S. Khush, a renowned agricultural scientist, is considered a leader of the 20th century's Green Revolution.

Born in India, Dr. Khush earned his bachelor's degree at Punjab Agricultural University and his doctorate in genetics from the University of California at Davis. He joined the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) in the Philippines in 1967, where he became principal plant breeder and head of the Division of Plant Breeding, Genetics, and Biochemistry in 1986, retiring in 2002. During his 35 years at the IRRI, he spearheaded the institute's rice-breeding program, developing high-yielding rice varieties with disease and insect resistance and superior grain quality that are now grown on 60 percent of the world's riceland.

Because of the more than 300 improved varieties developed under his leadership,

the world's rice production increased 135 percent between 1967 and 2000from 257 million tons to 600 million tons-enabling the major rice-growing countries to become self-sufficient in food production and saving countless millions from starvation. Furthermore, he developed cultivation methods that protected ecosystems through higher yields and improvements in sustainability, saving valuable forests, pastures, and rangelands. Today, the price of rice adjusted for inflation is 40 percent lower in domestic and international markets than in the 1960s, greatly benefiting poor segments of society.

Dr. Khush has written three books, more than 80 book chapters, and 160 research papers, and he has trained more than 300 rice scientists who now occupy key positions in their countries. He has served as a consultant in rice genetics programs in 15 countries, as well as advisor to the Rockefeller Foundation, the Third World Academy of Sciences in Italy, and the International Science Foundation in Sweden. He currently serves as a member of the Scientific Advisory Committee to the Department of Biotechnology of the government of India and as a member of the Science Council, an advisory body to the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences in Beijing.

Dr. Khush's contributions to the advancement of global food security have been recognized by numerous awards and honors, including the 1996 World Food Prize, the 1987 Japan Prize, a Scientific and Technological Cooperation Award from the Government of China, and the Padma Shri Award from the president of India in 2001.

Richard D. Johnson

Distinguished Service Award

ichard D. Johnson was a partner for 21 years with Arthur Andersen & Co. and retired as a partner of Accenture (previously called Andersen Consulting) in 1991.

During his career at Andersen, he served in a variety of local, national, and international management positions involving audit, tax, consulting, and professional education, including two years as the Andersen country managing partner for all firm services in Iran, Afghanistan, and Pakistan. He was a founder of Andersen Consulting's Change Management Service Line and a member of its worldwide management team.

Following retirement from Andersen, Mr. Johnson was founder of VIA International LLC, serving as chair of that firm, with offices in Chicago, London, New York, and Singapore until his 1999 retirement. He then continued consulting as RDJ Ltd. He is also the owner of Ventures 33 LLC, a real estate investment firm.

Mr. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in industrial engineering and his master of business administration from The Ohio State University and has remained close to his alma mater since his days as a student leader. A lifetime member of the Presidents Club, where he served two terms as chair, Mr. Johnson has served as vice-chair of the Alumni Association Board of Directors and on the Steering Committee of the Alumni Advisory Council.

He is a strong supporter of the Fisher College of Business, playing an active role as a fund raiser and advocate for the college in the Chicago and Naples, Florida, areas and as a former member of the Fisher College's Dean's Advisory Council. His service to the university also includes the College of Engineering Chicago Advisory Board and the Advisory Council of the Department of Industrial and Systems Engineering. With a particular interest in leadership training, he cochaired the committee to establish the Ruth Weimer Mount Leadership Initiative and created the Richard D. Johnson Leadership Endowment Fund to support Mount Leadership Society Scholars, In 1998, Mr. Johnson was awarded the Alumni Citizenship Award by The Ohio State University Alumni Association as well as the university's Gerlach Development Volunteer Award, and in 2002 he received the Fisher College of Business Distinguished Alumni Award.

James J. Mager Distinguished Service Award

ames J. Mager is now associate vice president for the management consulting firm of Noel-Levitz after spending three decades at The Ohio State University where he revolutionized the university's enrollment management systems before his 2002 retirement.

As associate vice president of enrollment management at Ohio State, he played a leading role in restructuring the university's enrollment management efforts as the university moved toward competitive admissions during the 1990s. Enrollment results credited to Dr. Mager's leadership include higher quality freshman classes, greater ethnic and geographic diversity, and stronger retention and graduation rates. He was also instrumental in helping Ohio State implement selective admissions policies.

Dr. Mager is a three-time graduate of Ohio State with B. S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in industrial and systems engineering. He began his administrative career at Ohio State in 1971 as a systems analyst in the registrar's office. In 1975 he joined the Office of Admissions, eventually becoming director of the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid. During the next 20 years he worked continuously to improve processes related to the recruitment and retention of students.

In 1995 Dr. Mager was named assistant vice president for enrollment management and then associate vice president for enrollment services. In this capacity, he oversaw the offices of admissions, First Year Experience, financial aid, and the university registrar. During these years, he was central to developing strategies for broader enrollment management, with emphases on honors students, merit scholarships, minority recruitment, and the role of the university's regional campuses.

In addition to his administrative duties, Dr. Mager played a critical advisory role to a number of important university committees, including the Council on Enrollment and Student Progress, the University Calendar Committee, and the Presidential Commission on the Regional Campuses. As always, he put the interests and welfare of the students foremost in a professional and collegial manner.

Dr. Mager's expertise has been and continues to be sought at the national level. He represented the university on the College Board, ACT advisory boards and research councils, the American Association of Collegiate Registrar's and Admissions Officers, and the National Association of Collegiate Admissions Counselors, and he has presented papers on enrollment-related topics at professional meetings throughout the nation.

THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY CLASS GIFT PROGRAM



THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

he colorful ceremonies of The Ohio State University commencements derive from practices originating in the Middle Ages. When European universities were taking form in the 12th and 13th centuries, the scholars were usually clerics, and consequently they adopted costumes similar to those of their monastic orders. Cold halls and drafty buildings called for caps and floorlength capes with attached hoods, and the sobering influence of the church probably influenced the staid character of the caps and gowns.

As the control of the universities gradually passed from the church, some

aspects of the costumes took on brighter hues. Old prints and engravings, however, reveal a strong similarity between the regalia worn in early universities and that of the present day.

In light of our nation's English heritage, academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times. To establish a standard of uniformity in regard to the practice, an intercollegiate commission was formed to prepare a code for caps, gowns, and hoods that has since been adopted by all academic institutions.

Originally round, the shape of the cap is now the familiar mortarboard square—

a shape which, according to ballad folklore, resembles a scholar's book. Legend also has it that the privilege of wearing a cap was the initial right of a freed Roman slave; the academic cap, therefore, has become a sign of the freedom of scholarship. The flowing gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress that might indicate rank or social status. The hood, reserved at The Ohio State University for those receiving doctoral and master's degrees, not only indicates the type of degree, but also is lined with the official colors of the university.

The Gown

Bachelor: The bachelor gown is black, full cut with long pointed sleeves.

Master: The master gown is black, long or short sleeves, with an arc-shaped panel extended for each sleeve.

Doctor: The Ohio State University Doctor of Philosophy gown is scarlet with gray velvet panels on the front and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Other doctor gowns are black with velvet panels and bars, the color of which is distinctive of the field of study.

Honors Emblem

The Ohio State University honors emblem is a scarlet and gray tasseled braid worn over the gown. Students eligible for this curricular honor are those graduating summa cum laude, magna cum laude, cum laude, with distinction, and with honors.

The Hood

Bachelor: Three feet long with a two-inch-wide velvet edging.*

Master: Three and one-half feet long with a three-inch-wide velvet edging.

Doctor: Four feet in length with a five-inch-wide velvet edging and panel at the sides.

The lining of all hoods, which is folded out, bears the official colors of the institution granting the degree. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study.


Cap and Tassel







THE LONG WALK

In 1893, the master plan for The Ohio State University campus proposed a group of buildings around a central open space. The first reference to this area as "the Oval" was around 1910. A year later, a very elaborate, geometric pattern of walks within the Oval was added to the plan. This included a lengthy east-west walk—today anchored on the west end by the William Oxley Thompson Library and on the east end by Page Hall and the Wexner Center for the Arts. By 1919-20, and possibly earlier, this came to be known as the "Long Walk." In the early years, freshmen were forbidden to be on the Long Walk. The penalty—occasionally enforced by upperclass students—was to be thrown into Mirror Lake.

As one of Ohio State's most notable landmarks, the Oval is a key aspect of the university's identity, as well as a hub of its active daily life.

In June 2004, a major restoration project got underway to ensure the Oval's historic character while, at the same time, to address the contemporary needs of the campus. Walkway replacement, an irrigation system, new turf, and new lighting will all help preserve the Oval's integrity and make the area better able to withstand and accommodate a wide variety of student activities and special events. The construction project was completed in June 2005.
